Dear Friends of the Brown Nurses

This year has seen the Brown Nurses team continue to grow and the work of the Ministry expand to provide hope and compassion for more clients in our community.

Many have struggled with cost-of-living pressures and raising inflation, significantly impacting on their ability to manage day to day, with many often going without meals or being able to pay to access medical care and assistance. Financial challenges, coupled with health challenges, have meant that many have an ongoing risk of losing their tenancies, which in turn significantly increases their risk of homelessness and risks their health, safety, and well-being. Most of our clients are very isolated, living alone, with few or no family or friends. Offering hope and compassion is critical to our mission and helps sustain our clients when times are difficult. Sharing Simon's story below will demonstrate the difference connection, advocacy and support can make.

Simon*, a client who has been in our care since July 2022, has a range of chronic and complex health conditions which significantly impact on the quality of his life and his ability to undertake many activities. He struggles to walk for more than a few minutes due to his shortness of breath and severe lymphoedema which has caused enormous swelling of his legs and feet. When we first met Simon, his poorly maintained unit was on the 14th floor of a public housing block where the single lift was often broken, preventing him from leaving his unit and the building. He was physically unable to use stairs. His poor mobility and the maintenance issues in the unit block posed a significant personal safety risk for Simon. Together these factors led to extreme social isolation and an inability to interact with others in the building and the wider community.

His social isolation exacerbated his mental health problems and subsequently his resilience. Simon often said that he had no one to support or advocate for him except for the Brown Nurses "you haven't given up on me. That's what usually happens, people give up on me". He appreciated being able to speak honestly and openly with the Brown Nurses about his life without judgement or feeling shame.

Due to the nature of his accommodation and his health, over the last year we strongly advocated on his behalf with relevant agencies to improve his living conditions. In October, success! Our advocacy resulted in Simon being moved to another unit in a well-maintained apartment block with appropriate amenities and ease of access. We continue to work with Simon to find activities that lessen his social isolation, such as shopping or enjoying a cup of coffee but his new surrounds have led to better engagement with his treatment team, improved his resilience and offered greater hope that things can improve.
